



Professor Wong is Mok Hing Yiu Professor of Medicine and Chief, Division of Neurology, Chinese University of Hong Kong. Professor Wong attended the University of New South Wales in Sydney, Australia. He completed a Neurology Residency at the Prince of Wales Hospital, Hong Kong. Professor Wong is currently the Secretary of the World Stroke Organization as well as the Associate Editor of the journal Stroke. He also serves as Associate Editor for Neurology Asia and as member of the editorial board for JNNP, Eur J Neurology, Chinese Medical Journal and Journal of Neuroimaging. He was the Chairman of the organizing committee of the 1st International Conference on Intracranial Atherosclerosis in 2004, the 9th International Symposium on Thrombolysis and Acute Stroke Therapy in 2006 and Co-Chair of the Scientific Committee of World Stroke Congress in Seoul 2010. His major research interests are various aspects of cerebrovascular disease such as intracranial atherosclerosis, neurosonology, epidemiology, cerebral blood flow, atrial fibrillation and clinical trials for treatment and prevention of stroke in Asians. Professor Wong was the recipient of the 2001 Bruce S. Schoenberg International Award and Lecture in Neuroepidemiology awarded by the American Academy of Neurology and the Gold Medal and Certificate for delivering the 2nd Annual Chapter of Neurologist Lecture of the Singapore College of Physicians in 2005. He is also the recipient of the 2011 Croucher Foundation Senior Medical Fellowship award in Hong Kong and a First Class Prize of the 2011 Ministry of Education University Research Award (Natural Science), China. He coordinates many international clinical trials in Asia. He published more than 350 peer-reviewed articles in scientific journals, including the New England Journal of Medicine, Lancet Neurology, Annals of Neurology, Nature, Neurology, Stroke etc.
